

RESOLUTION NO. 2001-130

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORONA, CALIFORNIA, PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTARY MILITARY PAY AND BENEFITS FOR CITY EMPLOYEES CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY WITH THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Military and Veterans Code of the State of California, the City of Corona currently provides full paid compensation including continuation of benefits during the first thirty (30) days of active military duty up to a maximum of thirty (30) days per fiscal year to employees who have been ordered to report to active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, some City employees may be called to active duty in support of military operations in the wake of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks upon the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the City of Corona believes it is in the public interest to support those of its employees serving in the reserves of the Armed Forces and to alleviate financial hardships which those employees and their families may experience as a result of being called to active duty during a national crisis; and

WHEREAS, the City of Corona wishes to extend temporary benefits for its employees who have been called to active duty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Corona, California, as follows:

Section 1: Military Leave of Absence including all benefits in connection therewith is hereby granted to all City of Corona employees called to involuntary active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States of America.


Section 2: In addition to the paid military leave of absence currently provided by the City of Corona, each employee of the City of Corona who has been called to involuntary active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States of America who has exhausted his or her annual military leave for the fiscal year shall be entitled to a salary and benefit continuation plan which maintains the same level of benefits provided by the City to the employee according to the employee's current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and receive a salary supplement to his or her military pay equal to the difference between the employee's basic military pay and such employee's actual monthly salary from the City.

Section 3: The City of Corona shall continue to provide the same level of benefit toward any health, retirement, dental or life insurance for such employees and their dependants as the employee had when called to active duty.

Section 4: The Human Resources Division of Management Services of the City of Corona is hereby authorized and directed to establish the operating policies and procedures necessary to implement the intent of this resolution, and the City shall not pay any wage or benefit provided herein until and unless the employee who requests such payment complies with such policies and procedures.

Section 5: The supplemental pay and benefits authorized by this resolution shall be effective September 11, 2001 and shall remain in effect until each employee is released from active duty.
